WHAT IS TN WARN

WARN is a volunteer-based Water/Wastewater Agency Response Network that prepares for disasters and allows drinking water and wastewater systems in Tennessee to receive rapid mutual aid and assistance from other systems in an emergency.

WHO CAN JOIN

TNWARN is available to all public and private drinking water and wastewater systems in Tennessee. Member response is strictly voluntary and is not mandated.

MUTUAL AID

Mutual aid is an agreement among emergency responders to lend assistance across jurisdictional boundaries.



MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

WARNs are governed by a common mutual aid agreement. Utilities sign the MAA agreement which then allows them to share resources with any other system in TN that has also signed the agreement.

The agreement covers issues such as requesting assistance, giving assistance, reimbursement, workers' compensation, insurance, liability, and dispute resolution.
